INTRODUCTION OF PRIOR LEGISLATION

ORD #44-2018

Mr. Pelot offered Ord #44-2018 for its second reading and asked the Clerk to read it:

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE BID OF SABLE SERVICES, INC. DBA SABLE ASPHALT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$54,648 FOR THE NORTON ADMINISTRATIVE PARKING LOT PROJECT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. Pelot explained we are moving on this so we get our place set so when the weather breaks, we can get the project completed. Ms. Whipkey clarified that the ordinance is for \$54,648 even though the bid came in at \$49,680. The 10% is included in case something arises, we can pay for it. If not, it will go back in the fund. Mr. Pelot moved to waive the third reading, seconded by Ms. Whipkey.

Mr. Pelot moved to adopt Ord #44-2018, seconded by Mr. Whipkey.

Mr. Tousley said that the parking lot is in a much better condition than some of our roads. We just paid to reseal it last summer. He agrees it could use the repaving, but the timing is not good – maybe a season or two ahead. For that reason, he will not be supporting this item tonight. Ms. Whipkey said that even after the cracks were resurfaced, it didn't look good two to three weeks after it was done and she had brought that observation to the Administration. Administration said that was all we could do at that time. Now, we are getting it for almost \$15,000 less than last year's price. This is where businesses come and our residents come. Plus, we have to keep it safe for handicapped individuals

to get up the sidewalks, as well. We are doing a lot for our roads now and we have to maintain our parking lot.

Mr. Karant asked about when work is done like this, is there a time period that the paving is supposed to last. Mr. Fowler said the preventative maintenance needs to be kept up after a paving and then it will last a lot longer. Mr. Fowler said his initial thought was to be done in thirds, because the cost was so high. We are actively trying to address the roads. We tried the crack seal and it did not hold up because of the water.

Mr. Kernan said if we take care of this now, we will have less work to pave it in the future. If we wait until it crumbles, we will have a lot more to do with base work. Mr. Fowler said that is why the 10% is in there in case we find base work needs to be done.

Mr. Pelot reiterated this is a much better price than last year. The Mayor said it was only a slurry that was put on last year and it did not hold up.


