**NORTON HEALTH ADVISORY BOARD  
CITY OF NORTON  
Wednesday, August 19, 2009**

The Health Advisory Board (NHAB) of the City of Norton, Ohio, convened for a public meeting in Council Chambers of the Safety Administration Building. Chairman Daniel Karant called the meeting to order at 7:00a.m. Mr. Safron was excused.

**II. CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES:**

The Board reviewed the minutes of Wednesday, July 29, 2009. **Chairman Karant called for a motion. Ms. Spisak moved to approve the minutes as submitted; seconded by Ms. Delnay. ROLL CALL: Ms. Spisak-Yes, Ms. Delnay - Yes, Mr. Karant-Yes, and Brenda Hlas - Yes. The motion passed 4-0, approving the minutes as written.**

**III. OLD BUSINESS:**

Chairman Karant stated that the question he had asked Mr. Bob Hasenyager at the meeting on July 29, 2009 about his neighbors septic and it has been taken care of and it is was on the July 2009 report from the Summit County Health District. (See Attached)

**IV. NEW BUSINESS:**


Chairman Karant stated that the meeting tonight is to try to devise a plan of what we would like to accomplish as a Board. He stated that he would like to write an article in the Norton Trading Post and maybe the Barberton Herald to inform the people that the Board actually exists and to let them know that they are invited to attend because they do not know what they really do. Ms. Delnay stated that when she was first on the board, she thought with her experience she could bring a lot to the Board. She doesn't want to feel like she is wasting her time but she would like to have the Board continue and thinks it requires not 1 persons opinion but a variety of opinions. Ms. Delnay stated she would really like to keep the Board but we need to make sure we are not wasting our time just getting together. Ms. Hlas stated that she thinks that the Board should meet before he meeting of the SCHD meeting so Mr. Karant could take the concerns to the SCHD. Ms. Spisak stated that we do need to have the Board because it wouldn't be right to have just one person being responsible. The presence of the Board is needed or possibly being available for the Mayor to council that there might be a time for them to come to us and I feel that the dissolution of the Board would be disagreed with. We need to be present as an Advisory Board or maybe just called upon when Administration needs us. Chairman Karant stated that he does want to write the article to place in the paper and he wants to talk to Rick Ryland, Administrative Officer, to inform him of the information the Board is doing and wanting to make sure that the Administration is still wanting the Advisory Board. He is stating that the citizens do not know that the Board is here. Ms. Fisher, Secretary of Boards & Commissions stated to Mr. Karant that when he writes the article he may want to inform the citizens to write their concerns and mail them to the Norton Health Advisory Board in care of The City of Norton. The secretary will then email the information to the Board members so they may be able to discuss the concerns before the regular SCHD meeting. Ms. Spisak asked if the other Boards are the same or if they are different. Ms. Fisher stated that the Parks and Cemetery Board and the Norton Health Advisory Board is recommending boards and the BZA and Planning Commissions are voting boards. Mr. Karant asked Ms. Hlas if she thought it would be a good idea for him to appear at a Council meeting and speak with the council people to keep them aware? Ms. Hlas stated that she thought it would be a good idea.


Mr. Karant stated that the immunizations for the flu vaccine have been moved up a month. He was told that the vaccines now last for a year. He stated that there is a series of 3 vaccines for some people that are high risk. There was more discussion concerning the flu shots and clinics. Mr. Karant stated the SCHD has started a drug repository prescription assistance program and gave a paper to the Board about the program. (See Attached).

There was more discussion about the different low interest loans from Summit County for helping with homes and septic and sewers. There was discussion concerning the sewer line for the people who live on Oak St. that have failing septic.

### SUMMIT COUNTY DRUG REPOSITORY PRESCRIPTION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM



UNUSED PRESCRIPTION DRUGS DONATED BY  
NURSING HOMES ARE AVAILABLE AT LOW  
COST TO SUMMIT COUNTY RESIDENTS IN NEED

Medications available vary from month to month based on donations and inventory. Medications do **NOT** include insulin products, medication requiring refrigeration or controlled substances (narcotics). Summit County Health District is **NOT** collecting medications.

#### Who is Eligible?

- Summit County residents who have no or limited medication insurance coverage.
- 18 years of age or over
- Have no reasonable financial means to pay for the drug prescribed or be a patient of a nonprofit clinic

#### What is the Process?

- Complete Drug Repository Program Worksheet and the Eligibility Statement available at [www.schd.org](http://www.schd.org).
- If eligible, obtain written order for medication and meet with L. Stemple, RN to complete order sheet.
- Participant must provide payment to Buderer Drug Company before medication is mailed (\$7.40 per prescription plus \$7.00 shipping). Prescription is mailed to participant.
