The Regular Council Meeting convened on Monday, October 24, 2016 at 7:00 PM, in the Council Chambers of the Safety Administration Building. The meeting was called to order by Charlotte Whipkey, President of Council, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silent prayer.

INTRODUCTION OF NEW LEGISLATION

ORD #86-2016

Mr. Kernan offered Ord. #86-2016 for its first reading and asked the Clerk to read it:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CERTAIN SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 856 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NORTON, OHIO; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

First reading only.

RES # 87-2016

Ms. Whipkey offered Res. #87-2016 for its first reading and asked the Clerk to read it:

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE AMOUNTS AND RATES AS DETERMINED BY THE SUMMIT COUNTY BUDGET COMMISSION AND AUTHORIZING THE NECESSARY TAX LEVIES AND CERTIFYING THEM TO THE SUMMIT COUNTY FISCAL OFFICER, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Ms. Whipkey stated this is boiler plate legislation and we need to get this back to the County as soon as possible. Ms. Whipkey moved to waive the second and third readings, seconded by Mr. Pelot.

ORD #88-2016

Mr. McGlone offered Ord. #88-2016 for its first reading and asked the Clerk to read it:

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DEPOSIT OF FEES RECEIVED FROM THE USE OF DIVISION OF POLICE VEHICLES FOR CONSTRUCTION ZONE SAFETY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. McGlone moved to waive the second and third readings, seconded by Ms. Whipkey.

Mr. McGlone explained that these are fees from the use of our police cruisers when they are on site during the construction phase of St. Rt. 224 and Cleve-Mass. Road. They are getting \$20.00 per hour for the use of our cruisers and we want to put this money into Fund 140 where we can then use it along with the funds from the towing and impound fees to purchase new cruisers in the future. Mr. McGlone moved to adopt Ord. #88-2016, seconded by Ms. Whipkey.

Mr. McGlone offered Ord. #89-2016 for its first reading and asked the Clerk to read it:

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING A UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE THREE YEAR COPS GRANT; DETERMINING TO PROVIDE A LOCAL MATCH FOR SUCH GRANT FUNDS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. McGlone moved to waive the second and third readings, seconded by Ms. Whipkey.

Mr. McGlone explained that this is for a three (3) year grant in the amount of \$119,267.00 and our match is \$39,755.00. This will be for a new officer for the next three (3) years. McGlone moved to adopt Ord #89-2016, seconded by Ms. Whipkey.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH GLAUS, PYLE, SCHOMER, BURNS & DEHAVEN, INC., FOR CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION SERVICES IN CONNECTION WITH THE SILVER SPRINGS ROAD RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Ms. Whipkey explained that this is regarding our ability to have an inspection officer that will not only look over everything to make sure the project is done correctly, but that our materials used are also correct. Ms. Whipkey moved to adopt Ord. #90-2016, seconded by Mr. Pelot.

INTRODUCTION OF PRIOR LEGISLATION

ORD #82-2016

Mr. Rodgers offered Ord. #82-2016 for its second reading and asked the Clerk to read it:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 1064.02 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NORTON, OHIO; APPROVING THE FEES AND COSTS OF THE RENTAL OF THE COMMUNITY CENTER BUILDING; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Second reading only.

ORD #77-2016

Mr. Rodgers offered Ord. #77-2016 for its third reading and asked the Clerk to read it:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 1066.02 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NORTON, OHIO; APPROVING THE FEES AND COSTS OF THE RENTAL OF PARK FACILITIES; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. Rodgers moved to adopt Ord. #77-2016, seconded by Ms. Whipkey.

ORD #80-2016

Mr. Pelot offered Ord. #80-2016 for its third reading and asked the Clerk to read it:

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AGREEMENTS WITH HUNTINGTON PUBLIC CAPITAL CORPORATION AND GARDINER SERVICE COMPANY FOR THE LEASE-PURCHASE OF VARIOUS ENERGY EFFICIENCY IMPROVEMENTS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. Pelot explained that this is a contract with Huntington Bank and Gardner Services for the electrical upgrades throughout the City with LED lighting, changing out the air conditioning units, etc., and it will take place over the next year. This contract term is for two (2) years for a total of \$556,000.00 but the savings will essentially pay for these upgrades. Mr. Pelot moved to adopt Ord. #80-2016, seconded by Ms. Whipkey.

ORD #81-2016

Mr. Rodgers offered Ord. #81-2016 for its third reading and asked the Clerk to read it:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 1066.04 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF NORTON, OHIO; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. Rodgers asked the Councilmembers if they were all OK with the current language which there were no objections. Mr. Rodgers moved to adopt Ord. #81-2016, seconded by Ms. Whipkey.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Mr. Rodgers discussed something brought to him today regarding our trash service and a complaint on Golf Course Drive. Mayor Zita asked if this complaint was from Mr. Lombardi and if so he has been advised about this situation. Mr. Rodgers stated that yes it was from Mr. Lombardi and that he would like to have this resolved ASAP because both Mr. Lombardi and his wife have difficulties getting the trash to the point where the rubbish company wants it to go to. Mr. Rodgers stated that under the current contract with the trash provider, they are to provide door service to anyone with a disability. Mayor Zita stated he would look into the contract language however he believed the private driveway is where the issue is and that we have already talked to Mr. Lombardi about that. Mayor Zita stated there had been some discussion between Mr. Lombardi and the rubbish company to have some sort of a bin to be set out at the end of the driveway. Mayor Zita stated he was involved in the earlier discussions and is not sure where it stands or if we will be able to rectify the problem. Mr. Rodgers asked Mayor Zita to clarify that and Mayor Zita stated he is not sure this can be rectified as it stands now with the contractor. Ms. Whipkey asked if this situation is because it's a private driveway or because it's a private road? Mr. Markey stated he would need to look at the streets index and see whether it's a private road or a private driveway to see how it's classified. Mrs. Richards noted this is not a dedicated road according to our listing. Ms. Whipkey stated in answer to Mr. Rodgers comments, she does know Mr. Lombardi would need to get something from his doctor and submit that to the City. Mr. Rodgers stated his question is that even though it may be a private driveway, they still have to provide that door service according to our contract don't they? Mayor Zita and Mr. Markey stated we will look at this. Mr. Rodgers stated that their trash is piling up. Mr. Markey stated we need to be careful as we don't want to advocate that we caused the trash trucks to go down Golf Course Drive and cause issues with wear and tear on the road.

Mr. Rodgers stated he understood the point Mr. Markey was trying to make, but we are already providing trash service to everyone on Golf Course Drive now; are we not? Mr. Markey stated he is not sure how it's being done and he does not have the facts at the moment. Mr. Pelot asked for an update on Cleve-Mass Road Widening project and Mayor Zita stated he spoke with the contactor last week and we are still on schedule.

NEW BUSINESS

There was none.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mayor Zita read several announcements (see attached).

Mrs. Richards announced that she is doing a charity drive for the holidays called the Pajama Program. This is a national 501 (c) (3) charity that collects donations of new pajamas and new books for children living in foster care, group homes. All sizes of PJs are accepted from newborn to adult 2XL, as well as all reading level books. She would be taking any donations from now until December 7, 2016 here in Council chambers. Monetary donations are also welcomed with checks made payable to Pajama Program.

PUBLIC UPDATES

Ms. Whipkey noted there is no Committee Work Session next week, the next one is November 7, 2016 and the next Council Meeting is November 14, 2016.

There being no other business to come before the Regular Council Meeting, the meeting was adjourned at 7:18 PM.
