The Regular Council Meeting convened on Monday, April 14, 2014 at 7:00 PM, in the Council Chambers of the Safety Administration Building. The meeting was called to order by Rick Rodgers President of Council, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silent prayer.

**COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE**

Mr. Grether noted that we have discussion on a new liquor permit for the Wolf Creek Tavern formerly the old Loyal Oak Tavern. Mr. Grether stated the City has received notification from the State of Ohio Liquor Board and that this license is for new ownership. The discussion of Council on this tonight is to determine if we desire to have a formal hearing, and Mr. Grether noted this location has had previous liquor permits, and he noted there are also letters of support from Chief Hete, Mayor Zita and Sen. Frank LaRose. Mr. Grether noted the new owner is present tonight if there are any questions. Mr. Rodgers stated he met the wife of the owner today and agreed to move forward with this as they are investing in our community and he welcomed their investment in our community. Mr. Pelot agreed, stated they are investing an awful lot and making a lot of changes to the property, this will be an added benefit to the community and wished them the best. Mr. Grether moved to accept this application without a public hearing, seconded by Mr. Pelot.

Motion passed 7-0. No formal legislation is required.

Mr. Shane Moore, the new owner of Wolf Creek Tavern, thanked all of Council for their support and gave a brief background of his family, and all of the work that they have done to the building, and the future of his new restaurant. Mr. Moore stated that they intend to employ approximately 20-25 local employees in the business.

Ms. Whipkey moved to remove Ord. #50-2014, seconded by Mr. Tousley. Ms. Whipkey discussed her concerns with the Simple Recycling agreement to Ord. #50-2014 and that she had raised the same issues last week, nothing had changed and the wording was the same. Mr. McGlone asked Mrs. Carr if this is going to back things up and Mrs. Carr stated she wanted to get moving with the advertising and coordinate this with the Norton Clean Up Day. Mrs. Carr stated she understood the changes requested and had verified the changes with the Company and that Justin is aware of the change; it's just working out the language and everything that was asked to be done has been approved by the Company There was discussion as to the wording of the legislation that it authorizes the Administration to enter into an agreement. Mrs. Carr stated she did not realize that Ms. Whipkey wanted to see the changes in the actual contract prior to passing the ordinance and had only attached it as an example of what they would most likely enter into. Ms. Whipkey replied that she would never agree to anything when there is a question as to how the document is written. Mrs. Carr explained Norton was a little different from what she was used to doing. Mr. Markey stated all the ordinances authorizing Administration to enter into contracts have the additional language that changes may be made by approval of the Administrative Officer that are not adverse to the City and it is not in the final form of the agreement. Mr. Markey added that Council is agreeing to the form, not the final form, and that Mrs. Carr has worked out with the Company to make the changes we want and she is authorized to make those further changes when the contract actually gets signed. Mr. Tousley stated it is our due diligence to see that the changes had been made before the vote. Ms. Whipkey stated that is why she wanted this addressed from last week to see the changes were made. Mr. McGlone suggested having only a first reading only tonight and we can change the attachment later and Mr. Markey stated that is proper and you can amend the legislation at the next meeting. Mrs. Carr asked if Ms. Whipkey would like the changes with the Company emailed for her review prior to the next meeting and Ms. Whipkey confirmed that is what she wanted. Ms. Whipkey and Mr. Tousley removed their original motions. Mr. Rodgers stated he has a request to amend the current year's budget. The County has awarded the City \$40,000.00 for demolitions of vacant homes, however we must spend it rather quickly, and we will be waiving the readings and adopting this evening. Mr. Pelot asked if the money needed to go into a special fund and Mrs. Starosta explained it went in as a line item and not a special fund. Mr. Rodgers moved to add Ord. #52-2014 to the agenda, seconded by Ms. Whipkey. Ms. Whipkey noted that we do need to move this rather quickly to get the reimbursement as we have went through all our current funds for demolitions. Mr. Tousley asked if this requires matching funds from the City and Mr. Rodgers replied no. Mr. Grether asked how many homes we are dealing with that the funds will cover and Mrs. Carr explained that we have two houses ready to go and a third one being examined for asbestos. The houses are at: 4960 Richland Avenue, 5007 S. Hametown Road, which hopefully will come down next week, and 1289 Norton Avenue. Ms. Whipkey asked if we know if we will have the opportunity for the matching funds for this year or next year and Mrs. Carr replied she was not sure. Mr. Rodgers stated these funds are from delinquent taxes and this is a use it or lose it situation.

Mayor Zita stated that he received an email from Judge Todd McKenney on a Good Deeds Program he would like to present for the residents this fall to review their property deeds. Judge McKinney would like to have a about a five (5) minute presentation for Council sometime in the future.
